Be Sure to Ask the Following Questions:

1. Do you have management on-site routinely checking my job?
2. Is your product EPA registered and compliant with all VOC regulations?
3. Do you spray the product on, or hand-apply directly to the shingles?
4. Can you provide me with an MSDS Sheet for the all of the materials you'll be using?
5. Can you give me references of prior clients so I can contact them directly?
6. What safety requirements do you adhere to?
7. Do you offer more than one color choice and provide samples?

Other Important Factors to Consider

- If anyone suggests that you don't have to do "anything" to your cedar roof, be sure to read as much information as you can regarding wood shingles in New England.
- Please don't accept a price that is 15% below other estimates that you receive because they won't be using the same materials, application methods or offering a similar warranty. At CRC we won't lower our quality or standards just to land your job because we know you won't be happy in the end.
- Obtain, read and understand documentation for ANY products used on your home. Make sure they have been approved by the EPA and compliant with any VOC State Regulations.
- If a contractor gives vague answers, uses broad generalizations or is reluctant to put things in writing you should eliminate them from consideration.
- When someone offers to estimate the project and **they don't specialize in cedar roofs**, be very careful and insist they provide you with their process, materials and references. Cedar roofs require training and skills to ensure perfection.
